The Reunion will be held at the same facility as last year, the **Rush Volunteer Fire Co Auxiliary Hall at Lawton**, **PA**. This facility is located about 5 miles south of the Birchardville Store. Travel to the intersection of Rt 267 and Rt 706 at Lawton (see location map at end.) The Senior Center is a white building located west of the intersection and is on Rt 3037. Any interested party is welcome to attend. We have lots of comfortable space here, so please attend if you can.

Minutes of Stone Family Reunion and Stone Street Memorial Association Meeting of 7/28/18

The combined meetings of the Stone Family Reunion and Stone Street Memorial Association were held at the Rush Volunteer Fire Company Auxiliary Hall at Lawton, PA on 7/28/18. This event was the 116th Stone Reunion. President Betty (Handrick) Baldwin welcomed the group and we sang Happy Birthday to Ruth (Handrick)(Blair) Furman recognizing her 99th birthday.



Chaplain Jessie Birchard Carr continued the welcoming comments and gave the invocation. The Stone Reunion song was played and sung, and then a hat was passed collecting \$191. The usual excellent buffet began at about 12:15 pm and the business meetings commenced at about 1:50 pm.

President Betty (Handrick) Baldwin recognized the four honorary members in attendance, Ruth (Handrick)(Blair) Furman, Courtland Bradshaw Birchard, Curtis Charles Stone, and David Arthur Shadduck. Curtis Stone's daughter Sara (Stone) Miller was introduced as a first-time attendee. Betty thanked the officers for their efforts and outlined each officer's duties. She indicated that one of our principal responsibilities was to oversee the maintenance of the Stone Street Cemetery and explained that the maintenance costs are our largest expenses. Betty also noted that this would be the last meeting of the Stone Street Memorial Association (SSMA) and that the assets would be transferred on or about September 1, 2018, at which time the SSMA would cease to exist. The Stone Street Cemetery Preservation Association, Inc. would receive the assets of the SSMA and would assume the responsibilities for Cemetery maintenance.

The next item of business was the Secretary's report by John Buck. On motion by Lyn Munn (second by Marleta Shadduck and approved) the reading of the 2017 minutes was waived and the minutes were accepted. All members had been provided with the minutes ahead of the meeting. John mentioned some communications with members that had occurred since the Invitation had been published. Betty Baldwin moved to accept the Treasurers' reports (second by Courtland Birchard and passed).

Under old business Betty Baldwin thanked Ron Smith and Eileen Birchard for making arrangements to use the Rush Fire Department's facility. On motion of Alan Blair, second by Bob Carr and unanimous approval, the Treasurers were authorized to donate \$50 in addition to the \$50 use-fee to the Rush Volunteer Fire Department in recognition of the excellent facilities they provide.

John Buck reviewed general maintenance at the Stone Street Cemetery. He noted that the north fence is in poor condition, but that enough new replacement fenceposts have been fabricated and some new 1" steel pipe had been purchased to replace some horizontal bars. John indicated that he plans to install the new fencing later in 2018. It was further noted that a flower urn, in honor of all burials at the cemetery, was placed before Memorial weekend. Louise, Eileen and Sheila have been keeping the flowers watered.

Under new business Vice-President Eileen Birchard asked for nominations for officers for the coming year. She also indicated that the current officers were willing to continue another term if there were no further nominations. On motion of Marleta Shadduck (second by Alan Blair and approved) the secretary was directed to show that the current officers were re-elected by unanimous consent. Also under new business Courtland Birchard showed a picture drawn by his mother's brother William Ackerman. Courtland also showed a poster on onionskin paper that advertised eggnog from Jersey cows. Courtland recalled that they used to sell chocolate milk from their farm on Cobb Hill Road, where his nephew, Denny Birchard and family, farm today. Ruth Furman thanked everyone for recognizing her birthday. She said she has been attending since she was a baby and looks forward to coming next year. On motion of Christine Buck (second by Cynthia Olcutt and approved), the business meeting was adjourned at 2:25 pm.

A program by Christine and John Buck was presented entitled "Review of 1904 Reunion" (this program is available on the website http://stonefamilyreunion.com/wp-content/uploads/2018/08/2018-SFR-program-Review-of-1904-Reunion.pdf. Aided by numerous individual photos and notes within Reunion records, the Bucks had studied the 1904 Reunion photo for several years and finally identified every one of the 136 individuals shown in the photo. Attendees of the current 2018 Reunion were quizzed to see if they could identify their ancestors in the photo. Some did better than others, but we all enjoyed looking at photos of ancestors and hearing about the 1904 Reunion.
